The First 100 Days Tracker is a look at some of the actions taken by Congress and the President

### PRESIDENTIAL ACTIONS:

- Executive Order minimizing the economic burden of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act pending repeal (January 20)
- Memorandum to freeze new regulations pending review (January 20)
- Memorandum reinstating a ban on international abortion counseling (January 23)
- Memorandum to withdraw from the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement (January 23)
- Memorandum freezing the federal workforce (January 23)
- Memorandums advancing the Dakota Access and Keystone XL Pipelines (January 24)
- Memorandum promoting "Made-in-the-USA" pipelines (January 24)
- Memorandum streamlining permitting and reducing regulatory burdens for domestic manufacturing (January 24)
- Executive Order to increase border security measures, building a wall, hire additional border agents and end the "catch and release" policy (January 25)
- Executive Order to prioritize for deportation of undocumented immigrants who have criminal
  convictions or have been charged with a crime, prohibits federal funding for "sanctuary"
  jurisdictions, and enables state and local law enforcement to effectively act as immigration agents
  (January 25)
- Memorandum on rebuilding the U.S. Armed Forces (January 27)
- Executive Order that bars executive appointees from lobbying for a period of five years after leaving the agency (January 28)
- Memorandum to plan and defeat the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) (January 28)
- Executive Order on reducing regulation and controlling regulatory costs (January 30)
- Executive Order regulating the financial system, and roll back of the Dodd-Frank (February 3)
- Memorandum to review the Obama Administration's "Fiduciary Rule" (February 3)
- Executive Order on preventing violence against law enforcement officers (February 9)
- Executive Order enforcing regulatory reform by requiring every federal agency to designate a "Regulatory Reform Officer" within 60 days (February 24)
- Executive Order reviewing the Waters of the U.S. Rule (February 28)
- Executive Order regarding a revised travel ban (March 6)
- Executive Order reorganize the executive branch and eliminate "unnecessary" federal agencies and agency programs (March 13)

### Veteran's Compensation Increased

- · The compensation for disabled veterans with service-related disabilities was increased.
- Veterans can go outside the VA to receive medical care at facilities closer to home.
- Congress passed the "VA Accountability First Act" which makes it easier to demote or fire any VA
  employee, including senior executives, for poor job performance or misconduct.

## **Major Elimination of Government Regulations**

- Congress passed 5 bills that killed costly Department of Labor regulations.
- · Congress repealed 14 harmful regulations that made it difficult for small businesses to thrive.
- EPA killed new rules under Waterways of the U.S.
- In 2017, over 1,600 planned regulations were canceled or delayed saving over \$8 billion dollars in regulatory costs.
- In 2017, 22 regulations were eliminated for every new one.

#### **Business Tax Relief**

- The new 20% Pass-Through Deduction slashes taxes for small businesses. Sub-S Corps, LLC's,
  Partnerships and Sole Proprietors WILL NOT PAY ANY FEDERAL INCOME TAX on 20% of net
  business profits when personal taxable income (marrieds) is under an AGI of \$315,000 per year.
- Provides for unlimited expensing of equipment purchases over the next 5 years.
- Doubles the death tax exemption to \$22 million for families and \$11 million for individuals.
